### ✧ ITEMS TO BRING

- Tent, and a ground cloth or tarp to put underneath. If you buy a tent but aren't sure how to set it up, don't worry – there will be plenty of people at the camp site to help you. If you do not have a tent, let your den leader know and we might be able to come up with one.
- Sleeping bag, pillow, and air mattress, cot, or pad if desired
- Rain coat/rain gear
- Warm jacket, sweatshirt, sweatpants (it might get cool at night)
- Extra clothing in case something gets wet or dirty. A good idea is to put a change of clothing in a sealed plastic bag. That way if you get water inside your tent, you still have dry clothes.
- Toiletry kit (washcloth, towel, comb, toothpaste, toothbrush, soap, etc)
- Insect repellent. You can buy repellent with Permethrin that can be applied to clothes prior to the campout. It lasts for several washings. You will also want repellent that can be applied to skin
- Sun screen and a cap or hat
- Folding chairs
- Extra pair of shoes for when one pair gets wet or dirty
- Water bottle or canteen. We will have water available. However, please bring water for your family as well.
- Pack 93 will provide a Saturday dinner of hotdogs, chips, fruit, and S'Mores. Sunday morning will consist of OJ, rolls and bars to eat as we pack. Please make sure to have a good lunch before coming out on Saturday afternoon.
- Flashlight or headlamp. Kids love to play flashlight games.

### ✧ OPTIONAL ITEMS

- Sunglasses
- Fishing Gear
- Balls, Frisbees, etc.
- First Aid kit. We have a basic first aid kit, but please feel free to bring one for your own convenience.
- Hand sanitizer. We have a large one we will set up. Again feel free to bring your own for convenience at your tent.
- Camera

### ✧ LEAVE AT HOME

- Soda pop. We will have water, lemonade and orange juice available to everyone. Soda triples the amount of garbage and no good comes from some boys having drinks that others do not.
- Ipods, CD players, DVD players, etc. These often get lost or broken on camping trips, and can disturb other campers.
- Alcohol, tobacco, firearms, and fireworks. BSA Rules Apply.
- Please limit cell phones to adults only. Just like Ipods and other like equipment, they tend to get lost or broken on camping trips. All activities are supervised, so there's no reason for boys to need their own phone.
